Questions arising from LIFT's Call for Concept Notes: LIFT Rakhine Programme

The deadline for written questions is on 18 December 2020. The first round answers are compiled and published on 17 December 2020 and the rest will be published on 22 December as scheduled.

1	Q1 Is there a maximum USD amount for which applicants can apply?
	A1. There is no maximum USD amount set for which applicants can apply.
2	Q2 How is the total envelope divided up over the three Components?
	A2. There is no predefined budget allocation per component.
3	Q3 The awarding of 20% of the total budget in direct funding to local organisations is mentioned as a percentage of the whole programme (page 7) and also under Component 3 (page 15). Please can LIFT clarify which it is?
	A3. LIFT aims to award 20 percent of the total budget of this call (i.e. the Rakhine Programme budget) in direct funding to local organizations.
4	Q4 Does the 20% funding to local organisations include funding received by local/national NGOs as part of a consortium with a lead INGO? Does LIFT anticipate supporting local partners through consortia?
	A4. LIFT aims to award 20 percent of the total budget of this call in <u>direct funding</u> to local organisations. LIFT has no position for or against consortia; LIFT would assume that consortia include local partners.
5	Q5 Can sub-partner organisations be included in more than one proposal?
	A5. Yes. Sub-partner organisations can be included in more than one proposal.
6	Q6 Can agencies submit more than one concept note?
	A6. Yes. Agencies can submit more than one concept note.
