- Post 1997 military major operations in South Eastern Myanmar.
- Emergence of terminology of IDPs.
- The birth of KDN begins with responding to the problem of IDPs.

Root Causes of Armed Conflict in Myanmar

- Lack of political negotiation
- Lack of opportunities for ceasefire and peace.

Consequences and Responses

- No recognition of Refugee/IDPs
- Low media coverage
- Humanitarian assistance
- Recovery and rehabilitation
- Relief



Dynamics of Nationwide Ceasefire Agreement (NCA) and Peace Process (2011-2015)

- Invitation to peace table on 18 Aug, 2011
- Signing of NCA on 15 Oct, 2015

Paradigm Shift (November 2018)



- Temporary suspension from Peace talks by KNU.
- RCSS's suspension from JMC.

Analysis of current situation

- Challenges
 - Territory Limitation
 - Remaining EAOs still undecided to sign NCA

Scenarios

- Positive
 - Critical and significant role of Civil Society
- Negative
 - Continued insecurity
 - Fear of resurgence of fighting
 - Fragile relationships can break down
